Our Post elections have been held for the 2018-2019 term. While we end the 2017-2018 chapter of our history and begin a fresh new page I am reminded of the many successes our organization has accomplished. Harold had some big shoes to fill as this position has been held by Charlie Penn for the past several years. Membership continues to be a fulltime job and I ask that everyone continue to support the efforts of growing our membership. Everyone is a recruiter and your help is needed.

As always, we continue to stay busy. We had a great Flag Retirement Ceremony despite the rain. Thank you to all who came out to participate in this time-honored tradition. In July we will have our Patt McCormick Memorial Golf Tournament. So it's time to get your team together and meet us on the course. In August we will have our Officer Installation Dinner & Dance. Normally we have our Post Clean up in August, but that has been moved to October, since the weather is a lot cooler. In September we will meet at the park for the Manchester Homecoming. So consider this an invitation and add us to your summer plans and come out and join in on the fun and fellowship.

And in closing, I am humbled by your confidence in my abilities to serve as your Commander for the sixth year. My goals will always place our service to veterans in the highest regard and the needs of promoting Post 208 to the District and Department as a top priority. "See you at the Post!"
